



# CAMPS AND EXCURSIONS POLICY

## 1. PURPOSE

- 1.1. To explain to our school community the processes and procedures the Victorian College of the Arts Secondary School (VCASS) will use when planning and conducting camps, excursions and adventure activities for students.

## 2. SCOPE

- 2.1. This policy applies to all camps and excursions organised by VCASS. This policy also applies to adventure activities organised by VCASS, regardless of whether or not they take place on or off school grounds.
- 2.2. This policy is intended to complement the Department's policy and guidelines on excursions, camps and adventure activities which all Victorian government schools are required to follow. VCASS will follow both this policy, as well as the Department's policy and guidelines when planning for and conducting camps and excursions.
- 2.3. This policy does not apply to student workplace learning or intercampus travel.

## 3. DEFINITIONS

### 3.1. EXCURSIONS

For the purpose of this policy, excursions are activities organised by the school where the students:

- a) are taken out of the school grounds (for example, a camp, day excursion, school sports);
- b) undertake adventure activities, regardless of whether or not they occur outside the school grounds

- 3.2. Principals, teachers, school counsellors and others involved in school excursions, must anticipate the possibility of litigation following an incident or injury. They must be prepared for a detailed examination of their planning, actions and the curriculum role of any activity.
- 3.3. **CAMPS** are excursions involving at least one night's accommodation (including school sleep-overs).
- 3.4. **LOCAL EXCURSIONS** are excursions to locations within walking distance of the school and do not involve 'Adventure Activities'.
- 3.5. **ADVENTURE ACTIVITIES** are activities that involve a greater than normal risk. Further information and examples of adventure activities are available on the Department's Policy and Advisory Library, at the following link:

- 3.6. Note: intercampus (NIDA / LAWLER) travel is not considered a school excursion.

#### **4. POLICY**

- 4.1. Camps and excursions can provide a valuable educational experience for our students which are complementary to their learning, as they provide access to resources, environments and expertise that may not be available in the classroom.
- 4.2. For all camps and excursions, including adventure activities, our school will follow the Department's Policy and Advisory Library: [Excursions](#).

#### **5. PLANNING PROCESS FOR CAMPS AND EXCURSIONS**

- 5.1. All camps and excursions will comply with Department planning requirements. All staff who organise or attend camps must complete the Excursions Learning Module on LearnED.
- 5.2. Part of this planning process includes conducting risk assessments, to ensure that reasonable steps are taken to minimise the risks associated with each proposed camp or excursion. VCASS's risk assessment will include consideration of arrangements for supervision of students and consideration of the risk of bushfire activity in the excursion location. In the event of a Code Red Day being announced, excursions or camp activities in affected locations will be cancelled or rescheduled. Planning will also cover arrangements for cancelling, recalling or altering the camp or excursion for any other reason.
- 5.3. Staff organising and/or attending camps and excursions must complete the LearnEd module for Camps and Excursions.
- 5.4. VCASS is committed to ensuring students with additional needs are provided with an inclusive camps and excursions program and will work with families during the planning stage, as needed, to support all students' attendance and participation in camp and excursion activities.
- 5.5. In cases where a camp or excursion involves a particular class or year level group, the Organising Teacher will ensure that there is an alternative educational program available and appropriate supervision for those students not attending the camp or excursion.
- 5.6. A camp or excursion that includes an adventure activity including swimming must be discussed with the Assistant Principal - Operations; organisation may not proceed without this.

#### **6. SUPERVISION**

- 6.1. All camps and excursions will comply with Department planning requirements. VCASS follows the Department's guidelines in relation to supervision of students during excursions and camps.
- 6.2. All excursion staff (including parent volunteers) will be familiar with supervision requirements and the specific procedures for dealing with emergencies on each camp and excursion.
- 6.3. All school staff will be aware that they retain overall responsibility for the supervision and care of students throughout all camps and excursions (including adventure activities), regardless of whether or not external providers are managing the activity.

#### **7. VOLUNTEER AND EXTERNAL PROVIDER CHECKS**

- 7.1. VCASS requires all camp or excursion volunteers and all external providers working directly with our students to have a current Working with Children Clearance.

#### **8. PARENT/CARER CONSENT**

- 8.1. For all camps and excursions, other than local excursions, VCASS will provide parents/carers with a specific consent form outlining the details of the proposed activity. VCASS uses Compass to inform parents about camps and excursions and to seek their consent. Parents/carers are

encouraged to contact the school to discuss any questions or concerns that they or their child may have with a proposed camp or excursion.

- 8.2. For local excursions, VCASS will provide parents and carers with an annual Local Excursions consent form at the start of each school year or upon enrolment if students enrol during the school year. VCASS will also provide advance notice to parents/carers of an upcoming local excursion through Compass. For local excursions that occur on a recurring basis (Gallery Studies or Kerrupon), VCASS will notify parents once only prior to the commencement of the recurring event.

## 9. PARENT PAYMENTS FOR CAMPS AND EXCURSIONS

- 9.1. Most camps and excursions provided by VCASS enhance and broaden the schooling experience of our students but are not a mandatory component of our curriculum. These activities are provided on a user-pays basis in accordance with the Department's Parent Payments Policy.
- 9.2. Consent forms will have clearly stated payment amounts and finalisations dates, and families will be given sufficient time to make payments.
- 9.3. Students who have not finalised payment by the required date for camps and excursions provided on a user pays basis will not be able to attend unless the Principal determines exceptional circumstances apply.
- 9.4. Where a camp or excursion is provided as part of the standard curriculum requirements, parents may be invited to make a voluntary contribution but all students will be able to attend regardless of whether their parents contribute.

## 10. FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- 10.1. VCASS will make all efforts to ensure that students are not excluded for financial reasons. Families experiencing financial difficulty are invited to discuss alternative payment arrangements with the Business Manager. The Business Manager can also discuss family eligibility for the Department's Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF), which provides payments for eligible students to attend school activities, including camps and excursions. Applications for the CSEF are open to families holding a valid means-tested concession card or temporary foster parents and are facilitated by the school. ## 11. REFUNDS

- 11.1. If a camp or excursion is cancelled by the school a full refund will be made. If a camp or excursion is altered by the school, or a student is no longer able to attend part or all of the camp or excursion, our school will consider requests for partial or full refunds of payments made by parents/carers on a case-by-case basis taking into account the individual circumstances. Generally we will not be able to refund payments made for costs that have already been paid where those funds have already been transferred or committed to a third party and no refund is available to the school. Where possible, we will provide information about refunds to parents/carers at the time of payment.

## 12. STUDENT HEALTH

- 12.1. Parents and carers need to ensure the school has up-to-date student health information prior to camps and excursions. A member of staff will be appointed with responsibility for the health needs of the students for each camp/excursion. Teachers will administer any medication provided according to our [Administration of Medication policy](#) and the student's signed [Medication Authority Form](#). To meet the school's obligations relating to safety, a first aid kit, student EpiPens and mobile phone will be taken by teachers on all camps and excursions.

- 12.2.** It is the responsibility of parents and carers to ensure their child/children are in good health when attending excursions and camps. If a student becomes ill during a camp and is not able to continue at camp it is the parent/carer's responsibility to collect them and cover any associated costs. If the Principal approves a student joining a camp late, transport to the camp is the parent/carer's responsibility.

### **13. BEHAVIOUR EXPECTATIONS**

- 13.1.** Students participating in camps and excursions are required to cooperate and display appropriate behaviour to ensure the camp or excursion is a safe, positive and educational experience for all students involved.
- 13.2.** Parents/carers will be notified if their child is in danger of losing the privilege to participate in an excursion or camp due to behaviour that does not meet the standards of behaviour set out in the school's [Student Wellbeing and Engagement Policy](#) and [Bullying Prevention Policy](#). The decision to exclude a student will be made by the Principal or Assistant Principal, in consultation with the Organising Teacher. Both the parent/carer and the student will be informed of this decision prior to the camp or excursion.
- 13.3.** If on a camp or excursion the Teacher in Charge considers an individual student's behaviour does not meet required standards, then the Principal or their nominee may determine that a student should return home during the camp or excursion. In these circumstances the parent/carer is responsible for the collection of the student and any costs associated with this.
- 13.4.** Disciplinary measures apply to students on camps and excursions consistent with our school's [Student Wellbeing and Engagement Policy](#) and [Bullying Prevention Policy](#).

### **14. ELECTRONIC DEVICES**

- 14.1.** Disciplinary measures apply to students on camps and excursions consistent with our school's [Student Wellbeing and Engagement Policy](#) and [Bullying Prevention Policy](#). Students may be permitted to bring electronic devices (such as iPads or mobile phones) on excursions but these may only be used during times set by the Teacher in Charge. Students are responsible for the care of any personal electronic device brought to an excursion and the school will not be responsible for lost or damaged devices.
- 14.2.** Students will not be permitted to bring electronic devices to camps except with prior approval from the Principal. The Principal will only approve students bringing electronic devices to a camp or excursion in exceptional circumstances and when it is in the best interests of the student, and may place conditions on its location and use during the camp or excursion.

### **15. STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES FOR FOOD, MATERIALS AND APPROPRIATE ATTIRE**

- 15.1.** Students are not permitted to bring their own supply of food items to camps and excursions unless the item is medically indicated and discussed with the Organising Teacher, or included as an item on the clothing and equipment list for that camp or excursion.
- 15.2.** Students are responsible for reading all information provided regarding the camp or excursion and ensuring that they bring appropriate materials and resources as set out by the Teacher In Charge,
- 15.3.** Students must wear or bring appropriate attire including footwear, weather dependent clothing and other activity-specific clothing as outlined in the camp or excursion equipment list.

### **16. ACCIDENT AND AMBULANCE COVER**

- 16.1.** Any costs associated with student injury rest with parents/carers unless the Department is liable in negligence (liability is not automatic).

**16.2.** Unless otherwise indicated, VCASS and the Department do not provide student accident or ambulance cover. Parents/carers may wish to obtain student accident insurance cover and/or ambulance cover, depending on their health insurance arrangements and any other personal considerations.

## **17. COMMUNICATION**

**17.1.** This policy will be communicated to our school community in the following way:

- d) Discussed at staff briefings/meetings as required
